

## ART SCANNING

## CRUSE SCANNING

- $\circ$   $\,$  The scanner bed is 48 in x 72 in. This is the only scanner like it in the Midwest.
- It is used to scan original paintings, mixed media images, and images encased in glass, with or without a frame.
- This scanner has the capability to create 3D lighting to give the print the illusion of actual texture.
- It also has the ability to scan images with flat lighting. This can be a benefit by reducing wrinkles or folds in an image just with the scan.
- The scanning bed has a built in vacuum to make sure the image is laying as flat as possible. This will cause no harm to the image.
- This method of capturing an image or art piece is far superior to photography. The scanner allows us to capture
  an evenly lit flat image. As stated above we also have the ability to create a drop shadow (the 3D lighting), which
  can be very tough for a camera to provide. Finally, the time frame of both capturing techniques; the scanner can
  do what a camera will do in a fraction of the time.
- The minimum starting rate is \$82.50. This is also the rate per 15 mins. After the first 15 minutes we can charge in 5 minute increments, which are \$27.50. Depending on the size of the image and the desired resolution, we can typically get 2-3 images scanned in 15 minutes.
- Test stripping the scanned image is available upon request.
